ESSENTIAL TO THE COMMUNITY

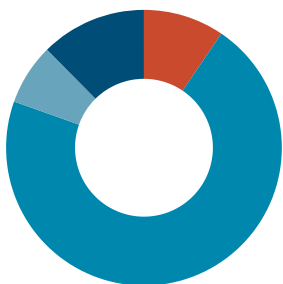
CHC has seen a 50% increase in the number of total patients in the last 10 years.

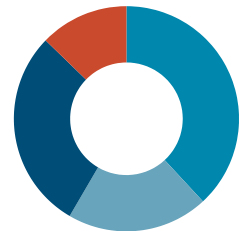
